

Release Commentary

- May Release is rated AMBER due to progress with SAPS Internal Testing, and Performance updates to CDR
- AEMO will overlap some internal test phases in lead up to Industry Test
- Industry Test for May still scheduled to commence as planned. Scope and Approach being addressed with ITWG
- In line with Readiness Approach checkpoint for go-live readiness in line with Industry Test Commencement
- LCCD procedure effective date proposed to be shifted to 1 November 2023
- Update to the MSATS v49.0 tech spec draft published W/B 27/2/23.
- ITWG meeting 30/3 with focus on the scope of Industry/Invitation testing for May release, Draft may go-live plan to be issued 5th April. aseXML schema r43 will support both B2M and B2B changes
- Revision to EMMS Data model v5.2 specification released 21/3 to address noted inconsistencies



5. Confirm Refresh Dates



Pre Production Refresh

Updated

- The refresh for Pre Production is confirmed for the week commencing the 11th April and will refresh both wholesale data and retail data.
- The environment will be available on Monday the 17th April for industry to start preparing for testing
- The targeted back date for the refreshed data will 3rd April for the wholesale database, retail will have data as at the 10th April.

Pre-prod Refresh update




- AEMO is currently experiencing a temporary level of technical and resourcing contention across the non-production environments including the NEM Reform program.
- The impact is that the planned refresh of the Retail pre-prod environment (MSATS) would likely now require an outage of approx. 3 weeks rather than the 1 week as originally scheduled.
- The primary reason for performing the refresh in lead up to May industry testing is to support Settlement run production for SAPS invitation Industry Testing.
- Given the to-date limited level of Settlement specific scenarios identified for this round of testing versus the impact of extended Pre-Prod outage and therefore likely reduction in the Industry Test window AEMO plans to defer this refresh until the Industry Testing for the October release where significant Settlement scenarios will exist to support both FFR and 5MLP testing.
- Testing of all other capabilities for May will be supported with the current Pre-Prod environment.



Appendix A: Competition law meeting protocol



AEMO Competition Law - Meeting Protocol

AEMO is committed to complying with all applicable laws, including the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (CCA). In any dealings with AEMO regarding proposed reforms or other initiatives, all participants agree to adhere to the CCA at all times and to comply with this Protocol. Participants must arrange for their representatives to be briefed on competition law risks and obligations.

Participants in AEMO discussions **must**:

- Ensure that discussions are limited to the matters contemplated by the agenda for the discussion
- Make independent and unilateral decisions about their commercial positions and approach in relation to the matters under discussion with AEMO
- Immediately and clearly raise an objection with AEMO or the Chair of the meeting if a matter is discussed that the participant is concerned may give rise to competition law risks or a breach of this Protocol

Participants in AEMO meetings **must not** discuss or agree on the following topics:

- Which customers they will supply or market to
- The price or other terms at which Participants will supply
- Bids or tenders, including the nature of a bid that a Participant intends to make or whether the Participant will participate in the bid
- Which suppliers Participants will acquire from (or the price or other terms on which they acquire goods or services)
- Refusing to supply a person or company access to any products, services or inputs they require

Under no circumstances must Participants share Competitively Sensitive Information. Competitively Sensitive Information means confidential information relating to a Participant which if disclosed to a competitor could affect its current or future commercial strategies, such as pricing information, customer terms and conditions, supply terms and conditions, sales, marketing or procurement strategies, product development, margins, costs, capacity or production planning.



Appendix B: Industry Testing Approaches

Approaches to Industry Testing



AEMO provides opportunity for Industry participants to test their updated systems and processes prior to release of AEMO updates into production.

The approach to the level of co-ordination, integrated planning and scenario management that is provided is dependant on a number of factors including:

- Impact to end-to-end participant process flows
- Ability of impacted participants to successfully test changes without AEMO or other participant co-ordinated activity
- Number and range of participants impacted by release

The approaches to Industry testing are described as:

Type of market testing	Description	Example
Industry testing	Self-testing of functionality such as connectivity, and/or coordinated multi-party testing of functional scenarios	Testing a change request (CR) or processing a reallocation or bid submission
Invitation industry testing	Coordinated testing of business process scenarios with a select number or subset of participants with systems ready for testing.	Testing NMI transfer Process
Market trials	Coordinated multi-party end-to-end testing of business process scenarios	Meter exchange involving CRs, service orders and 5-minute meter reads

In all cases involvement in testing is voluntary on participants behalf.

Agreement on approach to the type of industry testing for a release is conducted through the Implementation forum and Industry Test Focus Group along with support arrangements during the test period.
