

Integrated System Plan (ISP) Consumer Panel



AEMO is establishing an ISP Consumer Panel to inform development of the 2022 ISP under new rules that started on 1 July 2020.

Below are some key features of the new ISP Consumer Panel.



AEMO has published a call for expressions of interest for membership, including the Terms of Reference for the Panel's ongoing operation, and the required qualifications and experience to be appointed as a member.

The Panel provides written reports to AEMO on the ISP Inputs, Assumptions and Scenarios Report and the Draft ISP within two months of each AEMO publication. In developing the reports, the Panel must have regard to the long-term interest of consumers and seek to give its reports by consensus.

ISP Consumer Panel Reports form part of AEMO's ISP decision making and the Draft and Final ISPs will set out AEMO's consideration of ISP Consumer Panel reports.



There must be at least three members of the Panel, who require qualifications or experience in a field AEMO considers relevant to the assessment of the ISP or who have experience representing consumer interests.
