3 AEMC Rule Change Update

• AEMC provided an overview of the Unlocking CER benefits through flexible trading rule change and advised that a draft determination will be published on 29 February 2024.

- AEMC provided an overview of the improving security frameworks for the energy transition rule change and noted the a final determination is to be published on 29 March 2024..
- The AEMC advised that at the next RDC meeting in March, an update will be provided for the following rule changes:
 - o Integrating price-responsive resources into the NEM; and
 - Enhancing reserve information

Dominic Adams - ENA	Would the Improving security frameworks for the energy transition and unlocking CER benefits through flexible trading be a suitable candidate for an informed go live?	AEMO intend to take the Unlocking CER benefits through flexible trading through the informed go-live process and have commenced drafting of a High-Level Implementation Design (HLID) and Participant Impact Assessment for stakeholder consideration. This material will be released post draft determination. Given a pending final determination in March for the Improving security frameworks for the energy transition rule change AEMO do not intend to take this through a formal informed go-live process. However, AEMO is aware of key proposed dates and is intending to draft a HLID / PIA for this rule change, with recently work commencing. Where appropriate, AEMO intend to share its findings that may impact on its ability to meet the AEMC's proposed timelines – noting AEMO have previously indicated to the AEMC a DEC 2025 go-live for certain aspects of the rule change would be difficult to meet (refer to AEMO's submission to the AEMC's Second Update Paper).
	Improving security frameworks' rule may have potential impacts on structure of participants contracts with TNSP's.	Noted. Additional work required to understand overall impacts and what may be implemented in time to align with key proposed dates

4 Change Management & Roadmap Update

Lance Brooks (Slides 8-12)

- AEMO advised that serval material (and incremental) changes to the NEM Reform Implementation Roadmap (v3.1) were made and published in December 2023. Key changes captures in v3.1 are outlined on slide 9 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO outlined the next steps for publication of v4 of the Roadmap with detailed information outlined on slide 10 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO highlighted on slides 11 and 12 (in bold) the changes made since the previous RDC workshop in November 2023 and that it intends to captures as part of v4 of the Roadmap.
- In addition, AEMO advised that investment approval for SCADA lite was provided late 2023. AEMO
 are currently conducting a proof of concept with an expected date of April/May 2024.
- AEMO advised that a Change Register (v4) would be shared with RDC members post workshop for review and input.



 AEMO added that the Roadmap changes are mainly rule change driven and are assumed to be accepted by RDC unless any concerns raised.

5 **Bundling Opportunities Review**

Lance Brooks (Slides 13-17)

- AEMO provided a recap on the discussions at the November workshop associated with prioritisation and bundling opportunities. Further details are outlined on slide 14 and 15 and Appendix C of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO proposed a refresh of the program wide Participant Impact Assessment (PIA) for those initiatives with CY24-CY26 release dates, to act as a basis for a bundling and sequencing opportunities review. Detailed information on this assessment is outlined on slide 16 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO outlined its intention to share a PIA template based on previously conducted assessments, including the RDC's initial assessment conducted in 2022 and circulate to RDC members for review and input.

- AEMO provided a recap on the F&S initiatives and outlined a summary to date as outlined on slide 19, 20 and 21 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO noted that two main options have been considered and provided an assessment of these options against key drivers. Further information is available on slide 23 and 24 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO provided a financial assessment for the full scoop delivery (industry wide). Recommendations are outlined on slide 25 and 26 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO provided a summary of the overall recommendation for IDAM, IDX and PC initiatives with more information available on slide 28 of the accompanying slide pack.
- The business case summary was presented and in addition the intended process with further information available on slides 29 and 30 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO outlined the key milestones and next steps with key dates outlined on slide 31 of the accompanying slide pack. AEMO added that formal submissions to the draft business case package is due 9 February. AEMO welcomes one-on-one sessions in January/February and can reach out to <u>NEMReform@aemo.com.au</u>.
