1 Welcome and previous meeting minutes

Martin Maticka (AEMO) opened the meeting at 1:02pm, welcomed attendees to WAGCF No. 20.

The minutes from the previous WAGCF (20 July 2022) were endorsed. AEMO to publish the minutes as final on the website (action item 1.1).

2 GBB Trucking rule change

Sonia Botero (AEMO) provided an update on the amending rules, GSI rule 73A: Registered production facility operators to provide monthly trucked gas data and GSI Rule 89A: Publication of monthly trucked gas data on GBB. The amending rules will become effective at 8am on 1 December 2022.

3 Potential gas supply and demand forecasts

Christopher Meredith (AEMO) provided an overview of the forecasting approach and methodology, the updated potential gas supply forecasts, the updated supply-demand balance and provided a comparison to the 2021 WA Gas statement of Opportunities (GSOO).

Stakeholder questions and feedback:

Vivek Karia (JTSI): From the late 2020s, are you assuming the impact of the closure of coal-fired power stations offsets the impact of an increased renewables uptake? Does this explain the gap between 2021 and 2022 demand forecast?

AEMO: It does, the coal-fired power station closures put more pressure on GPG to provide the base load power at that time and the uptake of renewable penetration is not quite there by that point.

Susana Jardim (Woodside): What is the average shortfall that AEMO is forecasting from 2023 to 2026?

AEMO: It's a maximum of 50, the shortfalls are a total of 45 PJs over 4 years. Detailed numbers will be included in the GSOO.

Vivek Karia (JTSI): In the Graph, what is the NWS assumed DMO supply?

AEMO: 70 TJs a day

Allan McDougall (Gas Trading): Is it correct that the forecast shortfall is based on Gorgan and Wheatstone etc. running at 75-80% because of outages?

AEMO: They are forecast at 85%

Dominic Rodwell (Citic Pacific): Is the JTSI statement going to be in the GSOO this year?

JTSI: The WA Domestic Gas Commitment Statement (the Statement) will likely be published early next year. However, the date for publishing the Statement is not public.

4 National gas law reforms

Kaitlyn Bond (EPWA) provided an update on the National gas laws (NGL), accommodating hydrogen and other renewable gases, presenting a summary of the NGL reform process, the proposed NGL reforms and provided next steps.
